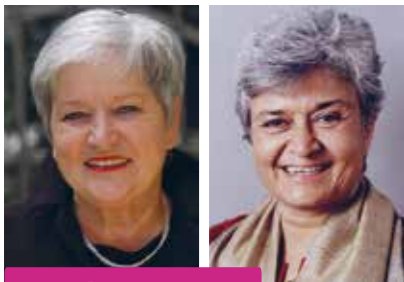

Ten years have passed since 1000 women were nominated for the Nobel Peace Prize and had their biographies published in a book. Now we are going a step further – by collecting the life stories of a new generation of peacemakers, and by asking what the last ten years have brought for our 1000 PeaceWomen.

The WikiPeaceWomen website, which will go online as part of our jubilee celebrations, is set to publish one million biographies over the coming years. The idea is to make visible the peace work done by so many women all over the world. The website will also allow the women to connect with each other directly and share their experiences.
